

St. Louis Area Checklist

The St. Louis area "circle" consists of the City of St. Louis and all points within 50 miles of its city limits, stretched a bit on the east to include the entire Carlyle Lake, IL area. To the north it includes Scottville, IL; to the south, Farmington, MO; and to the west, New Haven, MO.

The seasons are defined as follows

Spring (March - May)

Summer (June - July)¹

Fall (August - November)

Winter (December - February)

¹ Some shorebirds and other spring migrant species may be found into June; these are not listed in the "Su" column. Similarly, southbound shorebirds and terns often appear in July; these are fall migrants and, again, are not listed for "Su."

C: Common to abundant; should be found on most trips in proper habitat.

U: Uncommon; present in proper habitat, but more local and/or less numerous.

O: Occasional; occurrence usually annual, but in very low numbers.

R: Rare; found at intervals of 1 to 5 years. Species that are not rare on an annual basis, but found out of season at a frequency of 4 or more times, are marked "R" for that season.

*: Nests or has nested in area.

The rarest species are found in the Accidentals section at the end of the main list.
